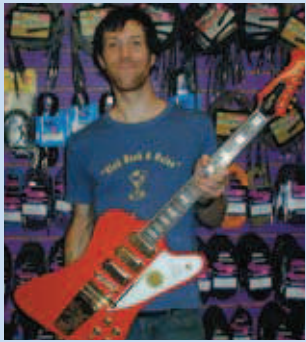


# Allston Village

## Sights to See

### Allston Depot

Now home to Captain Fishbone's The Sports Depot, the landmark Allston Depot was built in 1887 by the firm of H. H. Richardson, architect of Trinity Church in Copley Square.

### Allston's Murals

Come stroll the neighborhood and explore our murals. Some show people working and living in Allston, while others play up on the architectural details in our historic buildings. All contribute to the lively attitude in Allston Village.

### Union Square Park

This memorial statue and park commemorate the Hanoville Veterans of the World Wars. More than 50 restaurants, featuring cuisine from Brazil, India, China, Colombia, Greece, Italy, Japan, Korea, Russia, U.S., Taiwan, Thailand, Malaysia, Lebanon, Vietnam, and more.

### Ringer Park and Playground
