The Boston City Council's Committee on Public Safety to which was referred, on May 19, 2010 – June 9, 2010 and June 30, 2010 [respectively]:

Docket # 0732 – Message and order authorizing the Police Commissioner to accept and expend the FY 11 State 911 Dept PSAP and Regional Emergency Communication Center Support & Incentive Grant of \$2,296,567.00 from the Executive Office of Public Safety and Security State 911 Department.

Docket # 0733 – Message and order authorizing the Police Commissioner to accept and expend the FY 11 State 911 Department Training grant funds of \$408,330.00 from the Executive Office of Public Safety and Security.

Docket # 0734 – Message and order authorizing the Police Commissioner to accept and expend the FY 10 Safe and Drug Free Schools and Communities Act program funds of \$70,000.00 from the Executive Office of Public Safety and Security.


Docket # 0841 – Message and order authorizing the Boston Police Department Licensing Division to establish in accordance with General Laws Chapter 44, Section 53E ½ a revolving fund to accept from the fund up to a maximum of \$350,000.00 for FY 11 for New Hackney Driver Instructional Purposes.

Docket # 0842 – Message and order authorizing the Boston Police Academy to establish in accordance with General Laws - Chapter 44, Section 53E ½ a revolving fund to accept from the fund up to a maximum of \$200,000.00 for Non-City of Boston Police Officer Training.

Docket # 0843 – Message and order authorizing the Boston Police Department, Special Operations Division, to establish in accordance with General Laws - Chapter 44, Section 53E ½ a revolving fund for FY 11 and to accept from the fund up to a maximum of \$100,000.00 for Non-City of Boston Police Officer Training Purposes.

Docket # 0993 – Message and order authorizing the Boston Fire Department to establish and maintain a revolving fund which shall be credited with all receipts received pursuant to costs associated with General Laws – Chapter 21E, the Mass Oil and Hazardous Materials Prevention and Response Act.
