

- WHEREAS: Tulaine Shabazz Marshall served as national director of Graduate and Youth Opportunities at YouthBuild USA where she administered national efforts to help graduates of YouthBuild successfully enter college and the 21st century workforce; and
- WHEREAS: Marshall has significant leadership experience in national expansion, organizational development, program assessment, strategic planning, and training/staff development; and
- WHEREAS: A significant portion of Marshall's career has been spent launching educational organizations and helping them to grow, including Citizen Schools, the House of Blues Foundation, and the Benjamin Banneker Charter Schools; and
- WHEREAS: Citizen Schools annually honors a high achieving student with the Citizen Schools' Tulaine Shabazz Marshall Village Builder Award; and
- WHEREAS: Marshall, who serves as Vice President of United Way of Massachusetts Bay and Merrimack Valley, has presented workshops on the Nature of Conflict and Healing in Organizational Systems as well as Professional Development from a Peace and Justice Perspective; and
- WHEREAS: The United Way, under the leadership of Tulaine Shabazz Marshall and Christie Getto Young, launched SkillWorks, a public/private partnership of philanthropy, government, community organizations, unions, and employers to create a workforce development system that helps low-skill, low-income residents move to family-sustaining jobs, and helps employers find and retain skilled employees; Be It Therefore
