Dear Skating Enthusiasts,

Due to the enormous popularity of the Boston Common Frog Pond School Skating Program, we have some requirements to make your school skate more enjoyable for everyone. To provide your group with a safe and pleasant skating experience, we ask that you review the following rules carefully. Please familiarize your group with them before their visit to help prevent problems and injuries.

Proper supervision of your group is essential. Please staff your field trip accordingly. The requirements are described in our registration form.

Below are suggestions to help your event run more smoothly:

- Depending on the age of the group, children might need help putting on and lacing their skates. This is very time consuming. You may need more staff than we require. It is always better to have extra help, if possible.
- If you are bringing younger children, have them ask their shoe size at home, so they have some idea of what size skate they wear. This will help minimize guess work and size exchanges at the skate counter. We don't want them to miss out on any of their fun!
- Helmets are strongly recommended.
- **BOOK EARLY!** Don't wait until the season starts. Dates fill quickly. Groups are taken on a first come, first serve basis.

PLEASE READ YOUR REGISTRATION CAREFULLY. Fill it out completely or we cannot process your request. **A SEPARATE FORM MUST BE FILLED OUT FOR EACH DATE REQUESTED**, so print out your blank form if you intend to bring more than one group this coming season. School groups may not come more than once a week. Groups that cancel a booking will not be able to rebook in the same season.

To secure your skating date, please complete the enclosed registration form and "rink rules" and return it to my attention. All reservations must be made and confirmed in advance to receive special rates. A copy of your confirmed reservation must be brought the day of your visit. Happy Skating!

Skaters and Spectators understand and agree to the following:

- 1 – Maintain reasonable control of his/her speed and course at all times.
- 2 – Read and abide by ALL posted signs and warnings and cooperate with the rink staff.
- 3 – Maintain a proper lookout to avoid other skaters, objects, or conditions on the surface of the rink.
- 4 – Accept responsibility for knowing the range of his/her ability while on skates, and skate within that ability.
- 5 – Do not skate while under the influence of drugs, alcohol, or other control impairing substances.
- 6 – Leave the surface when resurfacing is taking place.
- 7 – Food and drink are not allowed on the rink surface or the surrounding dasher or cap rail.
- 8 – Refrain from acting in a manner that may cause or contribute to injury of oneself or another person.
- 9 – Assumption of risk agreement – by engaging in skating, skaters are deemed to have knowledge of and assume inherent risks of skating which include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a) Injuries that result from collisions or contact with other skaters or other individuals who are on the skating surface.
 - b) Injuries that result from falls.
 - c) Injuries that involve objects or artificial structures that are properly within the intended path of travel of the skater.
- 10 – Skaters will not throw or leave any foreign objects in the rink surface.
- 11 – Skaters will not instigate or become involved in any type of altercation with any other skater or with any spectator and will not engage in any abrasive, abusive, or disorderly conduct.
