Whereas; The city of Boston has historically had a rodent problem for many years;

and

Whereas; Over the last year there has been an increased rat problem in Allston-

Brighton, but that neighborhood is not alone; and

Whereas; The North End, Beacon Hill, the Back Bay, Fenway and Mission Hill have

also had their fair share of rat issues; and

Whereas: Increased construction projects exacerbate the problem, as do improperly

stored garbage and abandoned buildings; and

Whereas; There is an overpopulation of rats in the city and, as a result, they scour our

neighborhood streets in search of food; and

Whereas; As a result of the overpopulation, several homeowners, particularly in

Allston-Brighton, have seen rats in their homes; and

Whereas: The City of Boston knows there is a rodent problem and has been working

to control the rat population but more needs to be done, therefore be it

Ordered: That the appropriate committee of the Boston City Council hold a public

hearing and invite representatives from the City of Boston to discuss what

is being done to manage the rat problem.
