- Final Design (100%) and Bid Drawings
- Phased Construction
- Long Term Maintenance

- Identify Design Objectives

STEP 2: Alternatives Evaluation

- Develop and Evaluate Conceptual Alternatives
- Identify Potential Development and Open Space Parcels
- Select Preferred Conceptual Design

STEP 3: Preliminary Design

- Develop Preliminary Roadway & Parcel Design
- Parking and Access Guidelines Relative to Parcel Use
- Develop Cost Estimates and Phasing Strategies



roject Funding

- \$600,00 in City of Boston funding for design to leverage federal dollars
- Initial earmarks for design and early phase construction (\$13 million)
- Accepted as Major Infrastructure Project in State's long range plan (potential \$100 million)
- Potential for public/private partnerships with developers

Community Concerns (from first Meeting)

- Improve pedestrian access between the neighborhood and Sullivan Sq. Station
- Improve bus circulation and access at Sullivan Sq. Station
- Protect Main Street from cut-through traffic
- Truck traffic and truck impacts are important
- Congestion on Cambridge Street



Community Concerns (from first Meeting)

- Support for reducing the number of travel lanes and speed on Rutherford Ave.
- Need flexible street network to support appropriate future development
- Improve pedestrian crossings at City Square
- Need to provide bike lanes
- Coordinate with City of Somerville




1630 Map of Charlestown on 2001 Street Map




1775 Map of Charlestown by Lieutenant Page and **Captain Montresor**



1818 Map of Charlestown




View of Mill Pond

1848 Map of Charlestown








Charlestown on 1896 Chart of **Boston Harbor**


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Charlestown on 1907 Chart of **Boston Harbor**

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
