
Overview: Gaming in MA

Expanded Gaming in the Commonwealth:

On November 22, 2011, Governor Deval Patrick signed "An Act Establishing Expanded Gaming in the Commonwealth," legislation designed to provide significant benefits to the Commonwealth by advancing job creation and economic development.

The Gaming Act allows for up to three destination resort casinos located in three geographically diverse regions across the state and single slots facility competitively awarded for one location statewide.

In Region A – the Greater Boston region – two resorts are competing against each other for the gaming license. The state may select one of the two bidders.



Overview: Timeline


- December 19, 2013: Wynn Resorts files Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR)
- December 27, 2013: Wynn Resort found financially suitable by the Mass. Gaming Commission
- December 31, 2013: All casino applicants submit gaming application to the MA Gaming Commission. Boston receives a redacted version of two applications - approximately 43,000 pages
- January 13, 2014: MA Gaming Comm. and Wynn Resort formally acknowledge Boston as a "surrounding community" to the Wynn Resort



Overview: Timeline

- February 11, 2014: Comment Letters are due to the state environmental agency (MEPA) on the Wynn DEIR
- February 14, 2014: City of Boston Office Hours at Zume's Coffee House
- February 28, 2014: MA Gaming Comm. awards slots license to one of three applicants: (1) Plainridge Racecourse/Penn National, Plainville, MA; (2) Raynham Park, Raynham, MA; (3) Cordish Companies, Leominster, MA
- May 30, 2014: Award of License: MA Gaming Commission will award up to one resort casino license in Region A (Greater Boston) --- May extend this deadline
