From the desk of the Peter M. Grilli – President

The Japan Society of Boston & Showa Boston Institute

Founded in 1904, The Japan Society of Boston is the first and oldest American organization dedicated to strengthening ties of friendship and mutual interchange between Japan and the United States. The Society has collaborated closely with Showa Boston Institute for more than twenty years, and since 2008 Showa Boston has provided essential office space to The Japan Society of Boston. By doing so, Showa Boston has lent invaluable support to the Society, has allowed the Society's diverse programs in Boston and throughout New England to flourish, and has intensified the collaborative relationship between the Society and Showa Boston Institute.

Major contributions by the Japan Society of Boston to the City of Boston:

- Assistance and liaison to the City of Boston in all aspects of its relationships with Japan, particularly the Boston-Kyoto sister-city relationship.
- The Japan Society of Boston (JSB) coordinated the 50th Anniversary of the Boston-Kyoto sister-city relationship, collaborating closely with the offices of Boston Mayor Thomas Menino and Kyoto Mayor Daisaku Kadokawa.
- The JSB has frequently collaborated closely on Japan-related affairs with the Boston Office of Arts and Tourism, the MA Dept. of Tourism, MassPort, Massachusetts Office of International Trade and Industry (MOITI), and many other city, state, and public bureaus.
- The JSB provides consistent assistance, guidance, and support to the Consulate General of Japan in Boston in its interactions with public and private institutions in Boston and New England.
- The JSB played a central role in furthering the relationship of Showa Boston and the Colleges of the Fenway with the Kyoto Consortium of Colleges and Universities.
- The JSB played a key role in the development of nonstop air service between Boston Logan Airport and Tokyo Narita Airport, resulting in 2012 in the decision by Japan Airlines to inaugurate this nonstop air service, which is expected to bring dramatically increased business development and tourism from Japan to Boston.
- The JSB has provided advice and counsel to various Japanese public and private travel organizations seeking to develop tourism programs for Japanese travelers to Boston.
- The JSB has regularly counseled and advised the Boston Red Sox in its interactions with Japanese professional baseball leagues and with individual Japanese baseball players.
- The JSB has regularly provided support and counsel to Boston public schools that seek to enhance their exchanges with Japan or develop Japan-related curricula for K-12 teaching. Similarly, the JSB has assisted the Boys and Girls Clubs of Boston in developing a variety of Japan-related programs.
- Students at Showa Boston Institute frequently patronize Boston shops and cultural organizations throughout the year, and the JSB has on occasion provided liaison with such activities.

Public Programming by The Japan Society of Boston

The Japan Society of Boston has been highly praised for the quality and consistency of its year-round programming about Japan. The JSB is justifiably proud of its record in the field of cultural programming and its partnerships with many Boston-based cultural institutions (including the Boston Museum of Fine Arts, the Boston Public Library, the Boston Symphony Orchestra, the Boston Red Sox, the MA Historical Society, and countless colleges and universities in greater Boston, etc. The JSB frequently uses the facilities of Showa Boston Institute for its public programs and Showa students frequently serve as volunteers in the Society's programming. Recent public programs have included:

- Gagaku Concert of ancient Japanese music at Showa Boston Institute; audience 250+
- Lecture by Prof. Donald Keene, America's foremost scholar of Japan; audience 250+
- Regular film screenings at Showa Boston's Rainbow Hall for public audiences
- Lectures, panel discussions, concerts and other events at Showa Boston's Rainbow Hall

All Japan Society programs are open to the public as well as JSB members, and many of them are offered free of charge to the public.

Annual Dinner -- Each year, the JSB hosts a gala fundraising dinner to raise funds in support of JSB programs and activities. Typically, such events include 300-500 guests, and are held in major Boston hotels. This activity brings significant business to Boston's hotels, caterers, and other hospitality services. They also attract annual visitors and tourists to Boston. Showa Boston students regularly assist the JSB staff in preparing and executing the Annual Dinners and other such large-scale events.
